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Opikinawasowin: Métis Reproductive Justice from Hospital to Home. **Environmental Scan: Programs and Services for Reproductive Care and Family Wellness**

Purpose: As part of LFMO's Opikinawasowin: Métis Reproductive Justice from Hospital to Home Initiative, an environmental scan of available programs and services that support Métis women and families in reproductive care and wellness was completed. The search included organizations that support Métis communities at all stages of family wellness, including family preservation and reunification. It aims to identify gaps and opportunities while considering the lived realities and needs of Métis families from an intersectionality perspective.

Methodology: A search of programs was completed by Googling key terms related to audience ("Métis", "Indigenous", "FNIM"), location ("Canada", "National", each province), and targeted support area ("Birth", "Reproductive Care", "Pregnancy", "Parenting", "Childhood Care", "Family", "Child Apprehension", "Postpartum", "Prenatal", "Postnatal", "Maternal Health", and more). Additional search terms include "Support," "Group," "Service," and "Program."

The results from this search list are not exhaustive. As such, community consultations were conducted to elucidate additional available programs and services that may not be easily accessible through online searches.

Findings: The environmental scan yielded an extensive list of reproductive and family wellness programs and services available for Métis women, gender-diverse individuals, and families. Some programs focused on early family stages, including: Prenatal Support, Birthing Support, Healthy Babies, Parenting Support, and Nutrition. Others focused on later stages: Family Preservation, Family Support, Healthy Children, and Child Welfare. See Tables organized by province or region and life stage.

Conclusion: Various programs support each stage of family planning, birthing, and child development across Canada and the Métis Motherland. Analysis revealed that available programs and services address general health and social needs; there is a lack of specialized, culturally relevant programs that address the unique intersection of Métis identity and family systems.

The following tables outline various programs and services that support Métis women and families in reproductive care and wellness. The resource includes organizations that support Métis communities at all stages of family wellness, including family preservation and reunification. The tables below are organized by province or region, and life stage:

Reproductive Health: Various programs are available to support overall well-being related to the reproductive system, including family planning and sexual health education.

Prenatal Support: Numerous resources and programs are available to support the prenatal health of individuals who are pregnant or expecting to give birth. These resources aim to ensure a healthy pregnancy is achieved.

Birth Support: Some services offer direct hands-on support to facilitate the birthing process. Midwives and doulas provide comprehensive support throughout pregnancy, labour, and birth, focusing on the health and well-being of the birthing person and child.

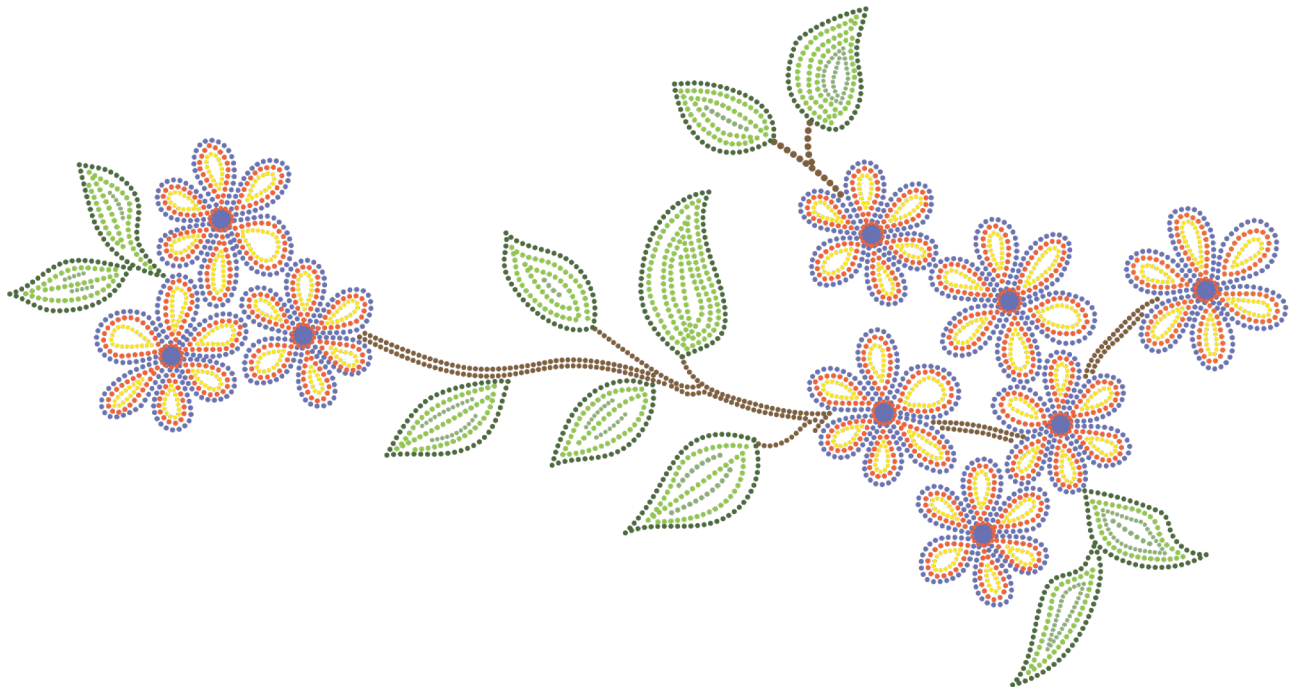
Parenting Support: In addition to pregnancy support, various programs offer resources and support for new parents as they navigate parenthood.

Healthy Development: Programs and services are available that focus on the healthy physical, emotional and social development of babies from birth.

Nutrition: Access to healthy foods is crucial during pregnancy and early childhood, as it is essential for healthy child development. Several programs and services are available to support education and improve access to adequate nutrition.

Healthy Family Programs: Numerous programs exist that aim to preserve family systems and maintain relationships, thereby protecting family units from child separation and reunification. Other programs and services aim to support the entire family unit, offering resources to address the diverse needs of families.

Child Welfare: Child welfare services are provided by provincial and territorial governments. However, programs and services are designed to support families throughout the process.

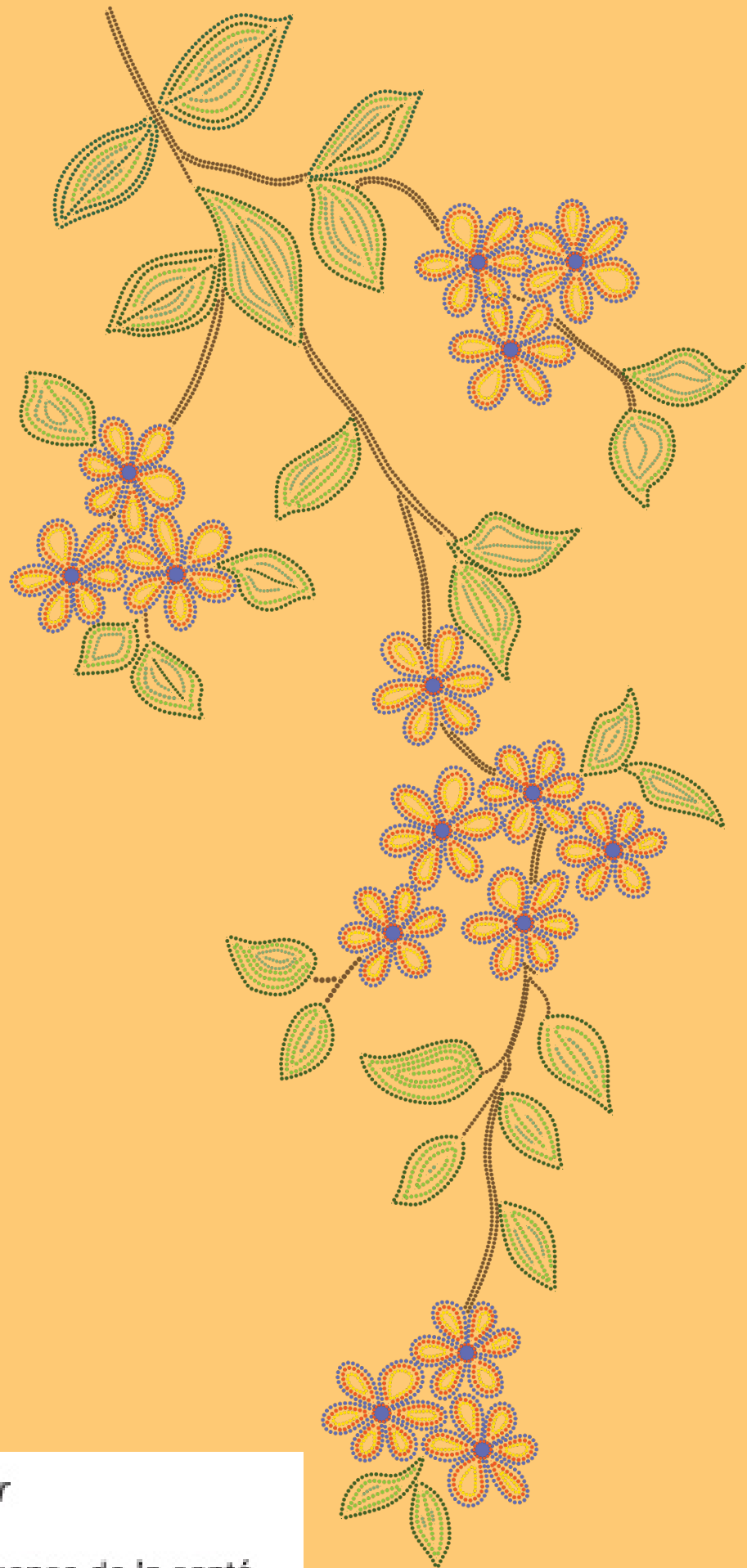
